
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The Nativity of Our Lord


And it came to pass in those days that a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. So all went to be registered, everyone to his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; because he was of the house and lineage of David: To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. (Gospel of Luke 2:1-7)

O sweet Incarnate Word, O most amiable Infant Jesus, behold me at last at Your feet; let me contemplate You; permit me to delight in Your beauty, Your goodness, Your immense charity! O Come Let Us Adore Him!

Angels are spiritual creatures that bring messages from God. In Christ's Nativity, the angels' messages had an important role. At the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel appeared to the Virgin Mary and said "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." The angel continued, "You will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High." The angel of the Lord appeared unto Joseph in a dream, saying "Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost. After Jesus was born a multitude of the heavenly host (angels) were visibly seen by shepherds shouting for joy over the birth of the Lord. The angels appeared to shepherds in the fields saying "Come and see." Millions of angels were giving glory to God by singing on the hills of Bethlehem at Jesus' birth. Later the angels told the Magi Kings not to go back to Herod; take a different route home. The angels also warned St. Joseph to go to Egypt to keep baby Jesus safe. God assigned each of us a guardian angel and at every Mass the angels are present and active.

In her liturgy, the Church joins with the angels to adore the thrice-holy God. So, what are they doing? What

exactly is their purpose? Angels adore God. Adoration abounds at events that they share with us. They sing, praise, and give glory to God constantly. "Holy, Holy, Holy!" We should spend more time trying to be more like the angels and we will grow to have an intimate relationship with God.



God and you. When you spend more time with an open heart in Adoration and just let Christ love you, then you'll fall in love too. That love will define you and allow you to be yourself. When you go, you see Jesus and He sees you. You pray, talk and listen hoping to do His will in your life. Adoration is a very beautiful and personal experience between you and God. Make it a habit.

So this Advent we need to make time and follow the example of the angels. Show Him how much we adore Him!

Feast of the Immaculate Conception



The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

on December 8 is one of the most prominent Marian feasts in the Catholic Church.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary breaks with the penitential simplicity of the Advent season to give us a chance to celebrate the Mother of God, through whom the incarnation of the Word of God was made possible. It celebrates Her nature as a holy and sinless woman from the time of her conception, and Our Lady gives us a model of a life without sin in con-

formity with God's will. As She is such an important figure in the Advent and Christmas seasons, the feast of her conception allows us to honor Her as we prepare for the coming of her Son.

On December 11 we will be holding a Christmas Advent Rosary Rally in Honor of Mary on Route 82 in Macedonia at the Veteran's Memorial Park at Noon. Bring your rosary and join us with 1000's across the country from America Needs Fatima. All are welcome!

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee.

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is the story behind the indigenous peasant who came across the Patron of the Americas and how he fought for her message to be heard. The Virgin of Guadalupe, like the shroud of Turin, appears on a piece of fabric. Both are sacred objects, hundreds of years old, and both depict an image said to be miraculous. The Virgin of Guadalupe was declared Queen of Mexico and is Patron of the Americas.

Our Lady of Guadalupe first introduced herself as the Mother of God and the mother of all humanity when she appeared on the hill of Tepeyac in Mexico in 1531. Juan Diego saw a glowing figure on the hill. After she had identified herself to him, Our Lady asked that Juan build her a shrine in that same spot, in order for her to show and

share her love and compassion with all those who believe. Afterwards, Juan Diego visited Juan de Zumárraga, who was Archbishop of what is now Mexico City. Zumárraga dismissed him in disbelief and asked that the future Saint provide proof of his story and proof of the Lady's identity. Juan Diego returned to the hill and encountered Our Lady again. The Virgin told him to climb to the top of the hill and pick some flowers to present to the Archbishop. Although it was winter and nothing should have been in bloom, Juan Diego found an abundance of flowers of a type he had never seen before. The Virgin bundled the flowers into Juan's cloak, known as a tilma. When Juan Diego presented the tilma of exotic flowers to Zumárraga, the flowers fell out and he recognized them as Castilian roses,


which are not found in Mexico. What was even more significant, however, was that the tilma had been miraculously imprinted with a colorful image of the Virgin herself.

The tilma is preserved since that date and showing the familiar image of the Virgin Mary with her head bowed and hands together in prayer, represents the Virgin of Guadalupe. It remains perhaps the most sacred object in all of Mexico. Juan Diego in 2000 was declared a Saint.

There will be a special Mass celebration and a renewal of our Consecration on December 13 at 6:30pm at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in Macedonia. Food, music and refreshments will follow.



Prayer for Priests and Religious



Our Lady of Rosa Mystica refers to Mary as Mother of the Church. We can find this name also in the Litany of Loreto. As the Rosa Mystica, Mother of the Church, we pray to her for the protection and strengthening of priests and religious orders, and for the flourishing of vocations. Her image has three roses. Each rose has a meaning: White – Prayer, Yellow/Gold – Penance and Reparation, Red - Sacrifice. These roses are to relieve the pain caused by three swords in Our Lady's heart: by religious souls who are betraying their vocation, to

repair mortal sin of those souls, and to repair for the infidelity of priests unworthy of their ministry.

Jake's Corner

St. Lucy's history has been lost and all we really know for certain is that this brave

woman who lived in Syracuse lost her life during the persecution of Christians in the early fourth century. Her veneration spread to Rome so that by the sixth century the whole Church recognized her courage in defense of the faith.

Because people wanted to shed light on Lucy's bravery, legends began to crop up. The one that has passed the test of time tells the story of a young Christian woman who vowed to live her life in service of Christ. Her mother tried to arrange a marriage for her with a pagan and Lucy knew her mother could not be swayed by a young girl's vow, so she devised a plan to convince her mother that Christ was the better partner for life.

After several prayers at the tomb of Saint Agatha, Lucy saw the saint in a dream. St. Agatha told Lucy her mother's illness would be cured through faith, which Lucy used to persuade her mother to give the dowry money to the poor and allow her to commit her life to God.

While Lucy and her mother were grateful to God, the rejected



bridegroom was deeply angered and betrayed Lucy's faith to the governor Paschasius. The governor attempted to force her into defilement at a brothel, but the guards who came to take her away were unable to move her, even after hitching her to a team of oxen.

The guards heaped bundles of wood around her but it wouldn't burn so they finally resorted to their swords, and Lucy met her death.

Lucy's legend did not end with her death. According to later accounts, Lucy warned Paschasius he would be punished. When the governor heard this, he ordered the guards to gouge out her eyes; however, in another telling, it was Lucy who removed her eyes in an attempt to discourage a persistent suitor who greatly admired them.

When her body was being prepared for burial, they discovered her eyes had been restored.

Lucy, whose name can mean "light" or "lucid," is the patron saint of the blind. She is often seen with the emblem of eyes on a cup or plate. In paintings, she is often depicted with a golden plate holding her eyes and often holds a palm branch, which is a symbol of victory over evil. Her Feast Day is Dec 13.
