



Hi everyone! I am very excited for the opportunity to be the administrator of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish. I look forward to meeting you all, celebrating the sacraments with you, getting to know more about OLG, and leading the parish forward. I will be the presider at all three Masses this weekend so you have the opportunity to hear from me. Again, I look forward to meeting you and being with you as the administrator.

Many of you are probably wondering, "What does administrator mean?" Bishop Malesic often will have priests be the administrator of a parish for roughly a year before naming the priest the pastor of the parish. This year of being administrator allows the opportunity to make sure things are going well before the priest becomes the official pastor. The role of the administrator is very similar to the role of the pastor but is a temporary role. I do believe the Bishop intends on making me your pastor but again this year of being administrator is a year to make sure things are working well before committing to the role of pastor. This is a very common practice in our Diocese that happens with most parishes.

This weekend we celebrate Father's Day weekend. Where this is a secular holiday (not a liturgical one) it very much applies to the life of the Church. God revealed Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is our Father and loves us as His children. We also have biological fathers and spiritual fathers on earth. We have men in our lives who are like "father figures" to us – maybe an uncle, grandfather or mentor. Fatherhood is critical to society and in the Church, we very much honor the role of the father.

My role as a priest is to be a spiritual father, and as your administrator to be your spiritual father. What does it mean for a priest to be a spiritual father? Fathers are meant to give life, protect and nourish life, and guide life. As a spiritual father it is my role to produce spiritual fruit which happens when people come into relationship with Jesus. As a spiritual father to bear new life by baptizing, feeding people with the Eucharist, hearing confessions, helping people to pray, give guidance on how to follow Jesus more closely etc. As a spiritual father I also bear the role of shepherding the parish and leading the flock. It is my responsibility to oversee the parish, guide the staff, volunteers, and provide leadership to the parish.

I am very grateful to God to be called to the priesthood and I love being a priest! If I could do it all over again knowing everything I know now I would immediately say yes again! There are many blessings to being a priest. One of my favorite parts of my daily life as a priest is the opportunity to meet people and help them in their walk with Christ.
