Hi everyone! I really enjoyed the opportunity to be with you all last weekend and have all of the Masses. Thank you for your welcome to me and thank you to the volunteers that served donuts and coffee after each Mass. It was very obvious to me after all three Masses last weekend that Our Lady of Guadalupe is a great parish! I look forward to getting to know your names, hear more about your experience as a parishioner, and leading us forward in Christ.

As I said last weekend, confessions are every Saturday from 3:30-4:15pm. If you would like to make an appointment Fr. Pat or I are happy to meet with you. Feel free to email or call us. Fr. Pat or I will be on campus most days of the week. Also, daily Masses will begin in July. We will have three noon Masses a week - Monday, Tuesday, and Friday of each week. We will have a 9am Mass Thursday July 4<sup>th</sup> for the holiday. I am meeting with the staff each week to learn more about the parish and continue to plan for our weeks and year ahead. It is very important to me that we work as a unified whole as a staff and volunteers. I am leading the staff on a retreat in August, and I am hosting a required meeting for heads of ministry August 21st at 6:30pm. I will send an email out to the heads soon. Again, the goal is that we work together as a parish, and have purpose and direction for the things we do at OLG. In this way we can drive our mission forward which is to bring people to Jesus!

Also, after talking with the staff it makes the most sense to move livestream to 10:30am Mass instead of 4:30pm. This will begin Sunday July 7<sup>th</sup>. I am certainly happy to provide livestream (and grateful to the volunteers who help run it) but just a reminder – livestream is for the sick, elderly, and those because of a medical condition who are not able to make it to Mass. Assuming you are in good health it is very important for us to be coming back to Mass in person. As a Church community we gather each weekend to worship God in the sacrifice of the Mass. The Church is Incarnational like Jesus. We meet in person for worship, we sing together, listen to readings together, pray together, receive Holy Communion together etc. We are one in our faith and in the Sacraments. So, if you have not yet come back to Mass – now is the perfect time! I welcome all back to Mass in-person (again unless you are very sick or elderly) and I look forward to meeting you!
