



Hi everyone! Thank you to all who participated in Vacation Bible School last week! As always, it's a great week with the kids and an opportunity to have some fun while growing in our faith. Thank you to Matt for doing an amazing job leading VBS, and a huge thank you to all of the volunteers!

Also, just a reminder from my announcement last weekend at Mass – if you are a Eucharistic Minister and bring Holy Communion to the sick after Mass please bring your empty pyx and place it on the altar before Mass. I will get a tray that we can place these on. After the closing hymn is concluded you can take your pyx and bring Jesus to the sick you are intending to visit. Thank you for making this adjustment and thank you for your dedication to the sick.

In this weekend's Gospel we hear of Jesus sending out His Apostles two by two to do the same works Jesus is doing. It's pretty amazing to see Jesus heal sick people and drive out demons, but, in many ways, its even more amazing to see His Apostles do these same works! We know Jesus to be God, but His Apostles are not God, so to see them doing the works of God is awesome!

This is the work of the Church even today is to continue the works of Jesus. Specifically, praying with sick people is something we can all do on a regular basis. I am blessed as a priest to bring the sacrament of anointing of the sick to the sick. In this Gospel from Mark 6:7-13 we hear that the Apostles, "anointed with oil many who were sick and it cured them." All sacraments are instituted by Christ, and in that verse we see the early roots of the Apostles anointing the sick with oil and it having a real effect on them. The Bishops are the successors to the Apostles and carry on the same Apostolic mission. Priests work under the Bishop and have the authority by the grace of their ordination to anoint the sick too. Fr. Pat and I anoint the sick on a regular basis at St. Barnabas. When the sick person is close to death the priest administers the anointing of the sick plus the Apostolic pardon which makes up the "last rites." In general, the anointing of the sick is something we provide like the Apostles did from the Gospel for this weekend.

All sacraments give God's grace to those who receive them, and the grace is given by the power of Jesus' Death and Resurrection. The anointing of the sick sacrament is meant for people who have a more serious illness (more than a common cold) and are under heavy mental, physical, or spiritual suffering. I have witnessed some people experience physical healings from the sacrament. Many people experience the grace of God's peace and strength to journey forward. Often their fears and anxieties lessen and they have the renewed hope and strength to continue in faith. In any case, the sacraments always communicate God's grace and so are very much worth receiving!

Every baptized person should pray for the sick and pray with the sick. Even though only a priest or bishop can administer the sacrament of anointing, every person can pray with or over a sick person. This is something I highly encourage you to do. Jesus desires to work miracles of healing through you if you are willing to let Him. We all have sick people in our lives whether its family, friends, coworkers or people we come across in our day. Take the next step to pray for the sick, and even better, pray with the sick. You can place your hand on their shoulder, say a prayer from your heart asking Jesus to heal them, then perhaps pray an Our Father and/or Hail Mary together. You can even just take a few moments of silent prayer with the sick person. You will be amazed at what this little effort can do to help bring God's healing, peace, and strength to those who are sick.



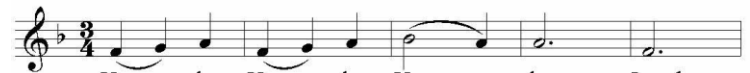

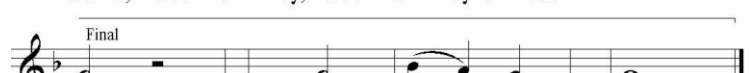
