Hi everyone! First of all, I would like to thank Janet Cox, Parish Council, and all the volunteers for the hard work and effort in putting on the parish picnic! It is always a great joy to bring the community together to grow in faith and fellowship. The parish picnic this year and last year reminds me of what an awesome community OLG is!

The theme for this weekend's readings is humility. This is a common Christian theme which we are all familiar with hearing about but I think we often do not understand it fully. Humility can often be misunderstood as lowering oneself in a way that one thinks negatively towards oneself. Perhaps you might think that if you are humble then you will always let someone's opinion dominate yours, or always let somebody else make decisions etc. This can tend to more of the "doormat" version of humility which is really a false humility since it reduces the "humble" person's dignity. A truly humble person should always be maintaining their dignity even if lowering oneself in a certain situation.

We should always start by look to Jesus. As St. Paul reminds us in Philippians 2:8, Christ "humbled himself" in coming down from Heaven. Yes, God did lower Himself in tremendous ways but taking on human flesh (as our Creator!) and becoming a creature, and by lowering himself to the cross. Jesus' whole life on earth was about lowering Himself and this is really how He won our salvation and won us over as His friends. Jesus' "humility" allows us to see that God is approachable and we should not be afraid of Him since He reveals Himself as one among us rather than dominating over us as a slave-driver.

In all of this Jesus never compromises His dignity. He does not allow the Pharisees to push Him around and speaks the truth rather bluntly to them. Jesus is not afraid to lead His disciples, teach them with authority, and take ownership for who He is in driving out demons, and proclaiming the Kingdom. Jesus' humility does not turn Him into a doormat. Now you might think this is the case with the cross but that would be the wrong way to interpret the cross. In His Passion Jesus is not allowing Himself to be "run over" but as the Gospels tell us at the Last Supper He said, "take and eat this is My Body." In other words, Jesus reveals through the Last Supper that His Passion is freely chosen and He chooses through it to lay His life down for us to take away our sins and destroy death. Jesus' Passion reveals great humility but does not reduce His dignity since He is really choosing to give His life fighting a greater and deeper battle than the violent one before Him.

I have always liked understanding humility in this way – to see our self the way God sees us. Please try praying this way, "Lord let me see myself the way you do." This is true humility since our personal pride cannot get in the way and we are asking God how He sees us. This also is not a false humility since God loves us and always upholds our dignity in the way He sees us. If we live our life always in relationship with God there is always humility since we are depending on Him as our Father and looking to Him for grace, insight, strength, and the power of His Spirit.

In the Gospel, Jesus talks about going to a banquet and taking the lowest seat at table and then allowing the host to raise us up to a higher position.

This is similar to what I said above- God is the host and we come to Him humbly not with our ego but with open arms and a trusting heart. Our first posture is always, "Lord send me where you will and let me do your will." Then from this humble, open posture God can raise us up and lead us according to His plan. Taking the "lowest seat" is also a way of identifying with those who are less fortunate in life and seeing true human dignity in every person that is equal to ours. But I really like how the humble person is also instructed to allow the host to raise him or her up to a higher seat. True humility means we let God lead even if it is raising us up in some way. Perhaps you place your life in God's hands expecting holiness to be a servant of His by doing basic daily chores or daily tasks. Perhaps over time God calls you to not just do day-to day tasks as a way of serving Him but to serve Him by leading a group and taking a "higher" role. Both are positions of service but one should humble accept what God is calling one too even if it is serving Him in a "higher" role.

Please pray this week for humility and again, try praying each day, "Lord, let me see myself the way you do." Then live out of this posture each day.





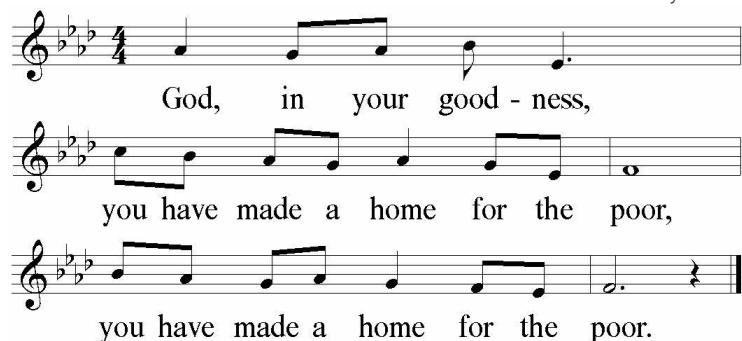

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully.
