Hi everyone! I hope your September is going well! It has been awesome to see ministries begin again this month. The first PSR Mass is this Monday the 15th and we look forward to welcoming the kids back! We also have 3 people in OCIA! We are still open to others that want to join so keep open to asking the person the Lord has put in your life to help in this way. OCIA began this past Monday so we are very grateful to begin this journey with them and hopefully any others the Lord is calling for this year! Matt also began youth group last week the teens had a very blessed experience learning more about St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and St. Carlo Acutis who were canonized last week.

This year we are looking forward to beginning a holy hour once a month with silent adoration and confession in the church space on the first Tuesday of every month from 6:30-7:30pm. Please feel free to come through and spend some time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. You can come for 5 minutes or the whole hour or anything between! Again, confessions will be offered from 6:30-7:15pm on these first Tuesdays.

We will also be putting on a men's retreat, women's retreat, and a family day retreat in the spring so we look forward to the opportunity to lead people deeper in their relationship with Jesus!

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. This Feast day always lands on September 14th and so this year we celebrate it at weekend liturgy which is exciting! This Feast day is celebrated in honor of St. Helena's discovery of the cross of Jesus back in 326 AD. As most of you know, Christianity was illegal for the first several centuries after Jesus' death and when Constantine became emperor of the Roman empire he legalized Christianity. At this time church buildings were built and Christianity became more and more embraced in the public sphere.

Helena was Constantine's mother and she was a devout Christian. She took a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to visit the special sites where Jesus was born, lived, and died. Helena had churches built to commemorate these special sites and the most notable site is Calvary where Jesus died and the empty tomb where He rose. This was the beginning of the church site called the Holy Sepulchre which to this day still can be visited to honor where Jesus died and rose! The Holy Sepulchre has undergone several expansions and remodeling over the years but still marks the same spot discovered by Helena and the local Bishop of the time in Jerusalem.

Even one step further, Helena was seeking to find the true cross of Jesus and so with the local Bishop's permission they began to excavate in the area of Jesus' death. They found three crosses (Jesus' and the two criminal's crosses) but did not know which one was Jesus' cross. Helena was said to have had a sick woman touch the three crosses and when she touched Jesus' cross she was healed and so this is how they discovered which one was Christ's true cross. The Feast of the Triumph of the Cross commemorates this awesome discovery!

This place of suffering exists for us and it is a place that we often cry out to God as Jesus did in Psalm 22 "My God, my God why have you abandoned me?" This Feast reminds us that Jesus conquered the cross by His death and triumphed over it. We too conquer these crosses and journey through them only in Christ.
