Hi everyone! This weekend is called Catechetical Sunday and the priest will give a blessing for the catechists at our parish. A catechist is someone who is trained to teach our faith and offer sound catechesis on Jesus and the Church. We thank these catechists for giving of their time to help instruct our people! And for the rest of us, please remember each of us is called to teach the faith in some way even if not at the parish. Parents – please remember you are the first catechists for your children and the way you teach, pray, and live your faith in the home is the first place of learning and instruction for your children!

In this weekend's Gospel Jesus teaches us, "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones." I find this to be very helpful advice in our daily lives, and in growing in the spiritual life. Perhaps it can be easy to dismiss the small matters of each day as unimportant or we could go the other way and over-think every small matter and become scrupulous thinking God is out to get us around every corner. Both of these approaches would be unhelpful. But in a healthy way to pay attention to how we deal with small matters is important and can make all the difference as we conquer larger matters.

I remember working at Panera Bread when I was in high school and often was stationed on the cooking line to make sandwiches, soups, and salads. At that time, we would get really crowded on a regular basis and so I had to work hard to keep up with the long lines, and the amount of orders that were continuously rolling through. In order to keep the station functioning well and most efficiently as possible, it was more about doing the little things right rather than how fast you could make a sandwich, soup or salad. For example, getting to work on time before the crowd came and doing preps was essential to working efficiently later when it was busy. We would spend the first hour or two prepping the sandwich line especially by pre-making the paninis and keeping them in the warmer. If the preps were not done then we would have to make every sandwich on the spot rather than drawing from some premade ones. Next, keeping the station somewhat clean and organized was important even in the midst of the busy time. If not, then the sauces and crumbs could begin to fall into the containers of the good food, make a mess, and cause more work by having to empty the container out (while wasting food) and re-fill it. Lastly, learning to work well with co-workers was essential to being efficient. We each had to assume our role and stay focused on that particular role and so work as a team. Each of these smaller things done well would allow us to accomplish our goal of serving the customers well especially when we were busy.

Our life with Christ and our growth in knowing Him and following Him is similar. Remaining faithful to a daily devotion and some regular time with God each day is a relatively small commitment but can make all the difference in the long-run. If we have no intentional time with God there really is no room for growth in the spiritual life and discerning how God is calling us forward each day.

Also, it could be easy to cut corners in the moral life and think it doesn't really matter. Perhaps you are married and you begin to talk with a person of the opposite sex more deeply. And then you continue to go deeper into the conversations and then begin texting regularly, and then talking regularly on the phone. Then you are finding excuses to leave the house to go catch up with this person. The path to emotional and/or physical infidelity usually starts by being faithful in the small matters and keeping it well-managed on that level and if not then it can quickly grow into something it never should be.

I believe this is also true with our finances. It might be easy to justify cheating the system in small matters, but that habit grows overtime and we could end up trying to justify it if we do not manage the small matters well. The same could be true of becoming careless with a credit card. If we do not manage our spending well in small matters then we could easily overtime slip into a really bad situation of credit card debt that we cannot pay back!

What are the small, daily tasks in your life that God is asking you to do well? Do you make some time for God every day? Do you commit to living morally well in small matters or have you been in the habit of cutting corners?
