## From the Desk of Fr. Jeffrey



Happy 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time!

One of my favorite things to do as a priest has been to go to CYO games to support our Nordon Hills parish communities. For one, it is a gift to be able to support our families and our schoolchildren as they compete on the field. But more importantly, it reinforces the idea that we are one parish community and family, which includes our priests and parish staff here!

As I watch our students compete, I am reminded that the joy of the Gospel is not limited to one hour a weekend at Mass. By no means! The Gospel is spread as we compete at soccer, football, volleyball, baseball, and cross-country matches! Part of the joy of watching these games is seeing the delight in a family's life when their son or daughter scores a touchdown, wins a point in a match, or nets a goal. In that joy, God is present! God's love is made incarnate in our lives – certainly in the sacraments, but also in our competitions and our daily lives!

All of this goes to say that God cares about what we do every day of our lives. God's love is not limited to our one hour of worship on weekends (though that is, of course, necessary and foundational!). Rather, God's love is also poured forth in our competition on the sporting field (whether we win or lose, God's love is present and active). God's love is present in our school community as we strive to be students who embody the compassionate love of Christ. God's love is knocking at the door of our work lives, seeking to make a difference in our "daily mission territory." God's love is beautifully present in our family lives, where the family reveals in an intimate way God's perfect love for us.

Do we notice God's love on the sporting field? In school? At work? In our home lives? Does God's love change how we act on a daily basis! Indeed, the call of our lives is to let the love of God spill into *everything* that we do! In our first reading, we hear the prophet Amos cry out, "Woe to the complacent in Zion!" This is not meant to be a fearful condemnation, but a summons to actively live in God's presence and to notice God's love at all areas of our life.

I invite you this week to answer the summons of Christ to live in God's love. Let what you receive here at Mass, the presence of God's love in the Eucharist, pour over into your daily life. Love God on the soccer or football field. Love God in school or at work. Love God at home. And look for signs of God's love all over your life.

The joy of the Gospel is present through, with, and in your life. It is certainly present in our students on the CYO field... I know God's love is active in your life too. Will you dare to notice God's love?
