One of our main goals as a parish is to engage those who have fallen away from the faith and begin to bring them to Christ. If you looked around the parking lot last Saturday most of the people were people we do not see on a regular basis and so this is a true victory that we can begin to engage them. It was also really nice to see the participation and service from our youth group serving lunch, and the Knights of Columbus helping to cook and other people who gave so generously of their time. Again this is an image of a missionary parish where the already faithful our serving those on the fringe when it comes to their faith journey and providing an opportunity for them to be open once again to Our Lady of Guadalupe parish!

This weekend we celebrate All Saints Day on November 1st and All Souls Day on November 2nd. St. Padre Pio was of tremendous value to me in discerning the priesthood. I saw in St. Pio someone who totally gave his life to Jesus and I found this very inspiring. St. Therese of Lisieux would become a great friend of mine through seminary. I often ask her for help and am reminded of the importance of her "little way." St. Ignatius became a great friend especially on retreats since he is a master of designing retreats and his spiritual exercises are very helpful as we navigate the spiritual life. St. John Paul II's presence, ministry, and teachings especially Theology of the Body have totally changed my life and so he is also someone I turn to frequently. More recently, St. Carlos Acutis has joined in for me and for this parish and school to help us grow in faith community. as

There are so many more but these are just a few. Again, who are the Saints you look to in your life? Call upon them and read the stories of their lives - this is a great way to grow closer to Christ.

Many who have died and gone before us need further purification before entering God's Kingdom in Heaven. Purification is something that happens on earth but if not completed needs to happen before we can be fully one with God. If I look at my life now versus ten years ago there has been a great deal of cleansing and purifying in my heart that has allowed me to be closer to God and follow Him more clearly. Often purification happens through suffering, and in suffering we call upon the Lord in a different way. Our pride reduces since we are going through a challenging time, and our dependence on God increases. We learn from these times and go forward differently when we come out of the suffering. God also helps us to change our lives and see things more and more from His perspective. We learn to turn away from sin and turn more and more to Christ. We learn to let go of bad habits and find greater freedom in our hearts to choose what is truly good for us. This is something we all go through and need to go through before we are fully one with God (which is Heaven).

We help each other in all walks of life and through purification. We accompany suffering people, pray for them and assist them in ways we are able. This continues in Purgatory (which is the place of this final cleansing) and so the Church asks us to pray for the dead and we assist them with our prayers. Especially in this month of November please remember to pray for the souls in Purgatory, and offer small sacrifices for them.
