



Hi everyone! I would like to thank you for being open to helping our parish with the increase offertory campaign. Thank you to those who have already submitted their pledge cards and if you have not yet done so please have the pledge cards back to us by this weekend if possible. You can place them in the collection basket at weekend Masses, drop them off at the parish office or mail them in. If now is not a good time for you to make this decision then please do so when you are able. If you are not able to give then please know I am just grateful for your presence and participation in our parish community!

December is fast approaching and our parish feast day is only about a month out!! Please mark your calendars for **Friday, December 12th to celebrate the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe.** We will have Mass at 6pm and a celebration after with food, music, and games. I love seeing the turnout we get for our parish picnic, and Trunk-or-Treat. This is even more significant for our parish than those events and would be a gift to see many of you at this event! Please mark your calendars and join us Friday, December 12th.

Our readings during the month of November continue to shift our attention toward end times and final judgement. The Church does this intentionally since we are coming to a quick close on the liturgical calendar which ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King next weekend! Then after that we begin the new church year with Advent in preparation for Jesus' birth and coming at Christmas.

As Jesus talks about the end times we reflect on both the destruction of the Temple that was about to come in 70 A.D. and also the end of the world at the second coming of Christ. In the first century the Temple was in the center of Jerusalem and Jerusalem was considered central to the world. Thus, when the Temple is predicted to be destroyed then this was also a sign of the whole world coming to an end. I realize this can be a heavy topic but I do think its worth our prayer and reflection.

Death is something none of us will escape. There is simply nothing we can do to live forever on this earth. Our last day will come whether its at the end of time or at the end of our life and for most of us it will be at the end of our life. Jesus predicts we will experience persecution and heavy crosses in following Him. He talks about family division, wars, and all sorts of trials that will come. Many of us have experienced some of these things already. As heavy and difficult as this sounds, He also asks us to persevere in following Him, and be prepared to give our testimony. If we think of any martyr in the life of the Church we think of people who have died for the faith. These people experienced persecution, division, war and heavy opposition like Jesus predicted and we hold them up because they persevered in Christ through the trial. Their martyrdom became a living testimony to the power of faith, the existence of God, and the reality of suffering and death leading to the Resurrection.

Maybe you wish you would have given more to the poor and needy. Again, life will bring many trials, persecutions, and difficult places to understand as Jesus talks about. In this weekend's Gospel He does not promise to stop these things from happening but He does promise to get us through if we persevere with Him each day. He will show up and His grace will not be lacking. Our perseverance in the Lord through any given trial will become a living testimony of faith and the power of God over suffering and evil.
