Hi evervone! I hope you had a very blessed Thanksgiving Day! It is so hard to believe but this weekend begins the start of the new liturgical year with the Advent season! This Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, we will publicly welcome our OCIA members with the Rite of Acceptance. We have been doing some preparation with them for the past several months (called the period of evangelization and pre-catechumenate) and now will begin the next step of preparation called the period of the catechumenate which is a period of continued study and spiritual growth. The unbaptized members now become catechumens and make a public declaration to the community that they desire to follow Christ. The alreadybaptized members become candidates and publicly declare they intend to come into full communion with the Catholic Church. As the Church community, we are called to embrace these catechumens and candidates, pray for them on their journey, and express our welcome and support of them especially in this time. As the Body of Christ, we are not disjointed members but we are one in the Lord as His Church, and called to support these new members who are seeking to come into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Advent is here! This is a very beautiful season of preparation for God's coming into our world and into our lives and is so easy to let it slide right by. Of course, much of this is brought upon us by our current culture this time of the year. I say this every year - I truly, truly enjoy the festivities of this time with lights, cookies, festive songs, hot chocolate, Christmas ale, etc. There is something enjoyable about these things but we must not let them hijack the Advent season and it is too easy for this to happen. We must always go back to the original meaning of this time of the year which is Christ's birth. This is incredible news! God has chosen not just to lead a plan of salvation through Israel, but to come down from Heaven himself! This is an amazing gift that the Lord would want to be that much a part of His creation, our lives, and so directly participate in our humanity. This reveals so much of what God really thinks of us and we don't want to miss this!

On our end, it is crucial that we are receptive to what God is offering. He is revealing that He wants to pour Himself into our lives and immerse Himself even more into our daily journey. Will we let Him? Do we realize our need for this?

Advent is the opportunity to come to realize our need for God. As human beings, we need pauses in our year to regroup and come in touch with the most important things in our lives. Often, the most important things get neglected for superficial things. The world throws so much at us with busy schedules and this constant need to prove ourselves through our careers, sports, our living situation, etc. that we focus too much of our attention here and begin to cut God out, perhaps our families begin to take a backseat and we enter the chaos that doesn't really lead us anywhere.



Again, Advent is a time to regroup, and re-center on what really matters.

This, of course, begins with making time for God, slowing things down, taking time to pray, reflect, read the Bible, have a daily devotional, and let that love we begin to experience overflow into people in need.

I am not asking you to completely reject all of the cultural festivities this season. But will it hijack your Advent? Will it prevent you from what is most important? Will it steal the real meaning of this time of the year? As Christians, we need to be the ones to turn the tide back away from the cultural meaning and refocus this season on Christ. This will only happen if we are willing to do it ourselves.

Please pick up one of the daily devotionals and use it this Advent. I encourage you to make a plan for this Advent season that will honor the dignity of the season. Make it something you can accomplish and that will challenge you even in small ways. Make a few commitments like coming to Sunday Mass each Sunday, and take the ten minutes for a daily devotional. You could even use the Hallow App if that's easiest for you. Also, try to be attentive each day to how you can do something for someone else that is a little inconvenient perhaps. Perhaps work on reconciling a relationship that has been broken if that is appropriate. And make time for Confession to let sin go and really be ready for the graces of Jesus' birth. God wants to come into your life anew – that's what this season is about. Will you make time to be receptive to Him and prepare yourself for Him?
