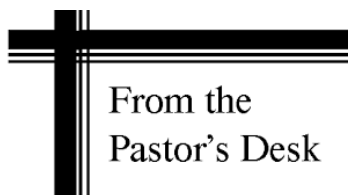

Hi everyone! Last Saturday we had a group of teens go to the CLE 2:16 Conference which is a conference for teens held every year by the Diocese. I am grateful to Matt Griffith and Fr. Jeffrey for being with our teens last Saturday at the conference and allowing them the opportunity to encounter the Lord more deeply in their lives. There were about 700 plus teens from all over the Diocese at the conference!

I would like to inform you that, beginning Monday the 19th, parish office hours will change here at our parish. We will have office hours Monday through Friday, 9am-2pm. Monday evening, we will have office hours 4-7pm and Wednesday, 5-7pm. We will no longer have the Sunday morning office hours. I am making these adjustments after observing activity in the office over the past year and a half and these adjusted set of hours seem to fit our level of activity better.

I would like to reflect with you on the gift of Adoring the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and why it is so important for us as Catholics to have this time with Jesus. I hope in this year of 2026 we can commit time to being before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Some of us might be wondering – what is Eucharistic Adoration and why do we do something like this in the Catholic Church? As we know, we have a very profound belief that at every Mass Jesus is present to us in Word and Sacrament. The Church teaches us that Jesus is truly present in the Sacraments and God's grace is given to us through them. Out of all the seven Sacraments the Eucharist is unique in that Jesus comes to us in the most substantial way through the gift of His Body and Blood. In the Eucharist, Jesus fulfills His teaching in John 6 that "My flesh is true food and my Blood is true drink (NAB, John 6:55)." Jesus also tells us in Matthew's Gospel, "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age (NAB, Matthew 28:20)." The Eucharist is the special place where Jesus remains with His Church until the end of time.

During Mass the priest holds up the host right after he consecrates it to give the people a chance to acknowledge and adore Jesus in the precious Body. This pause and holding up of the consecrated host is only a few seconds and then Mass continues. Eucharistic Adoration is like an ongoing time before the consecrated host. We place the consecrated host in the monstrance (device which holds the consecrated host so people can venerate Jesus) and place the monstrance in the Adoration Chapel or, on Mondays, we place Jesus on the altar in the main church. The practice is that Jesus is not to be left alone in the monstrance and always has someone present before Him. You might think of Jesus entering His agony in the garden and saying to the Apostles, "Could you not keep watch for one hour (NAB, Mark 14:37)?"

What is the purpose of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament? There are several answers to this. First and foremost, this is an opportunity for prayer and prayer is to spend time with God. We can pray anywhere and God is present even within us by our Baptism but there is something special about taking time to pray before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. It can help us to get away from our homes and busy lives and go to another place to pray like Jesus going to the garden or mountain to pray. The church is a consecrated place for worship and a special place where we encounter Jesus in the Sacraments and at Holy Mass.
