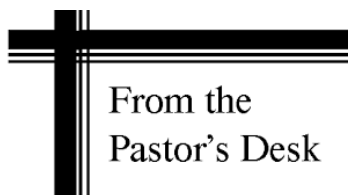

Hi, everyone! I hope you are enduring well through this cold winter! I have been thinking that this is the first real winter we have had in several years. The last few years we had a few cold weeks or even a cold month, but this winter has been going strong since Thanksgiving! And it doesn't seem to be letting up. Anyways, we live in Northeast Ohio, so we shouldn't expect warm winters!

There are several different themes this past week that all seem to tie back to a central point of honoring the dignity of every human person. We celebrated Martin Luther King, Jr. last Monday when we remember his nonviolent approach to calling our nation to reverence the dignity of the human person regardless of their race.

This past Thursday was the March for Life when we continue to pray for an end to abortion and for laws to protect the unborn. Here, we are looking to the unborn and remembering their dignity even though they are so young.

The Church also celebrates and promotes Christian unity this past week of January when we remember the dignity of all Christians even if they are not Catholic. Yes, we do believe that the Catholic Church holds the fullness of Jesus' revelation and so we do have this unique identity among Christians, but we do not see non-Catholics as less than us as human beings nor should we look down upon them. Rather, we should work with them where we are able to build God's Kingdom, like in our efforts of evangelization, service, praying, and reading our Bibles. We should always be open to leading them to the fullness of God's truth in the Church, but at the same time, work with them where we are able.

This past week, we have been reading from the First Book of Samuel in our daily Mass Lectionary and this really is an excellent book to read and pray with. On Tuesday, January 20th, we had the reading about God choosing the next king of Israel in Chapter 16. This is a wonderful passage where all of the sons of Jesse are presented to Samuel to be the next king and God says "No" to the first six, even though they "appear" to be the best fit by their stature, presence, and abilities. We hear the piercing line, "Not as man sees does God see, because he sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart." The point here is that God takes that deeper look beyond human appearance and looks into our hearts. It is easy for us to revert back to only seeing human appearance and not taking that deeper look into each person. It is easy for us to make quick judgments from human appearance and forget that each person carries the same dignity from God even if that are tiny, elderly with dementia, poor and on the streets, the immigrant, people of a different nationality or religion. We are called to look deeper with the Lord and this can be difficult because we justify judging someone by appearance.

Who in your life are you reverting back to judging by appearance? Is it the unborn, the immigrant, poor person who we push to the side, maybe a relative that really bothers us, or a boss that we disagree with? It is certainly okay and even good to disagree with people, especially

when it comes to faith and morals, but we should not be treating them with less dignity like using passive-aggressive behavior, gossip, or just refusing to acknowledge someone because we disagree.

I always appreciated G.K. Chesterton's approach in these matters. Chesterton was a convert from Anglicanism to Catholicism in the late 19th century and a well-known author. He was very bright and would debate people pretty intensely about the truths of Catholicism but even after a strong debate, much disagreement, and "looks into the heart" (NAB, Samuel 16), he would be known to go out for a beer afterward with his opponent. This is a good example of holding to what we believe while treating everyone with the same dignity.
