From the Pastor



Hi, everyone! Happy Holy Week! I cannot believe we are here but this is the most important Church week of the year! Even if you have had a difficult Lent and perhaps struggled to hold your commitments, I invite you to give your best to the Lord this week. Try to be as open to Him as you can each day and prioritize prayer and even coming to our Liturgies this week leading up to Easter Sunday. It would be very easy for this week to “slip by” us and all of a sudden, we are just at the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. But journeying through this week with Jesus is crucial for entering into Easter Sunday well.

It all begins with Palm Sunday this weekend. We will hear of Jesus’ procession into the Holy City Jerusalem where He is hailed as king and then mysteriously is turned on and becomes the source of everyone’s dysfunction through their mockery, anger, violence, betrayal, etc. In a sense, He goes from being their great hope to their source of hatred. It is an interesting turn, but unfortunately it is the reality of living in a broken world.

As we know theologically, Jesus is not just getting pushed around by His enemies, but is truly taking on the sin, darkness and dysfunction of the world upon His own body and offering it in sacrifice. We know this precisely because of Holy Thursday where Jesus tells us that He is making an offering of His Body and Blood as a sacrifice for sin and giving Himself to permanently establish God’s covenant with His people. This is the beautiful gift of The Last Supper and the Eucharist is its transformative power of Jesus laying down His life for us through the evils of the world. God takes all the darkness and transforms it into the source of our salvation! What an amazing mystery of this week!

You and I all live this reality in some way in our lives. We encounter the darkness of the world through mockery, jealousy, hatred, violence, bitterness, betrayal, etc. Our lives also bear this mystery in some way. As we allow this place of our lives to surface this week, we then have the opportunity to meet Jesus in this suffering and unite it to Him. In Jesus, these dark places of our lives also become transformative and can become a powerful offering for our enemies, or those who have pushed against us. This is the beauty of the Christian journey, even though it can be very difficult to offer oneself for those who have betrayed us, but this is what Jesus did!! This is fulfilling the commandment to “love one another as I love you.”

As we take the time to journey through this week with Jesus and unite these dark places with His agony, betrayal and Passion, then we can truly rise to new life. The Resurrection comes through the cross and we conquer the crosses in our lives only in Jesus.



Celebrant: Dear brothers and sisters, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of his Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that he entered his own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps, so that, being made by his grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in his Resurrection and in his life.

Blessing of The Palms

* Gospel *Matthew 21: 1-11*

When Jesus and the disciples drew near Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tethered, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them here to me. And if anyone should say anything to you, reply, 'The master has need of them.' Then he will send them at once." This happened so that what had been spoken through the prophet might be fulfilled: *Say to daughter Zion, "Behold, your king comes to you, meek and riding on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."* The disciples went and did as Jesus had ordered them. They brought the ass and the colt and laid their cloaks over them, and he sat upon them. The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the

road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest." And when he entered Jerusalem the whole city was shaken and asked, "Who is this?" And the crowds replied, "This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth in Galilee."

One of the Twelve, who was called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said, "What are you willing to give me if I hand him over to you?" They paid him thirty pieces of silver, and from that time on he looked for an opportunity to hand him over.

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the disciples approached Jesus and said, "Where do you want us to prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He said, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him, 'The teacher says, "My appointed time draws near; in your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples.'" The disciples then did as Jesus had ordered, and prepared the Passover.

When it was evening, he reclined at table with the Twelve. And while they were eating, he said, "Amen, I say to you, one of you will betray me." Deeply distressed at this, they began to say to him one after another, "Surely it is not I, Lord?" He said in reply, "He who has dipped his hand into the dish with me is the one who will betray me. The Son of Man indeed goes, as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed. It would be better for that man if he had never been born." Then Judas, his betrayer, said in reply, "Surely it is not I, Rabbi?" He answered, "You have said so."

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, from now on I shall not drink this fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it with you new in the kingdom of my Father." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

Then Jesus said to them, "This night all of you will have your faith in me shaken, for it is written: *I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be dispersed*; but after I have been raised up, I shall go before you to Galilee." Peter said to him in reply, "Though all may have their faith in you shaken, mine will never be." Jesus said to him, "Amen, I say to you, this very night before the cock crows, you will deny me three times." Peter said to him, "Even though I should have to die with you, I will not deny you." And all the disciples spoke likewise.

Taking the body, Joseph wrapped it in clean linen and laid it in his new tomb that he had hewn in the rock. Then he rolled a huge stone across the entrance to the tomb and departed. But Mary Magdalene and the other Mary remained sitting there, facing the tomb.

The next day, the one following the day of preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate and said, "Sir, we remember that this impostor while still alive said, 'After three days I will be raised up.' Give orders, then, that the grave be secured until the third day, lest his disciples come and steal him and say to the people, 'He has been raised from the dead.' This last imposture would be worse than the first." Pilate said to them, "The guard is yours; go, secure it as best you can." So they went and secured the tomb by fixing a seal to the stone and setting the guard.

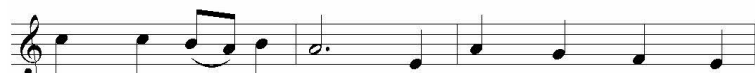

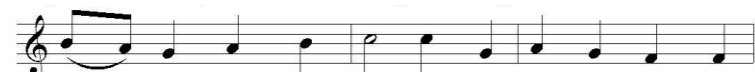

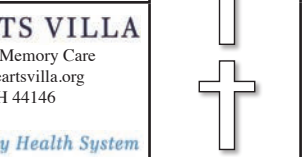
