From the Pastor

Hi everyone! I hope your Easter season is continuing to go well and I pray you have experienced the graces of the Resurrection at some point in these past few weeks!

I would like to extend a huge “thank-you!” to the women’s retreat leadership team and all those who volunteered to make this an awesome event last Saturday! We had over 75 women show up, which is amazing, for our first retreat! The real point of any retreat day is to have a renewed encounter with Jesus and to be renewed in our relationship with Him, and His love for us. We know this intellectually but retreat days are meant to help this reality sink deep in our hearts. I pray each of the women had this encounter with Jesus, and I pray each of us has this encounter with Jesus this Easter season. Please ask Jesus to renew your heart this Easter – be intentional and truly ask Him directly. We are meant to be filled up once again in the Spirit during this season – but we must ask for it!

This week, we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday which is always the Fourth Sunday of Easter on the Liturgical calendar. We hear from the Gospel of John, Chapter 10 where Jesus teaches us that He is the Good Shepherd and when we recognize His voice, and follow Him, then He will lead us to “have life and have it more abundantly (NAB, John 10:10).” This is always a good reminder for us – Jesus came to give us an abundance of life. Sometimes we forget this because, at times, our crosses in life can be heavy and it does not feel that Jesus is giving us Resurrection and life as He promises. When we go through ongoing illness, suffering, grief, daily struggles and we pray and pray but the struggles continue, then where is all this abundance of life that Jesus promises?

Remember that when Jesus rose from the dead, He revealed Himself as God who will raise us up! As I mentioned in my Easter Sunday homily – this is guaranteed when we follow Jesus both at times in this life and especially in eternal life (perhaps not always on our timeline, but will happen!). In raising Jesus, the Father reveals His plans to us that the cross will lead to the Resurrection if we follow Jesus! We must never forget this and get caught in discouragement.

In John 10, Jesus tells us that His sheep come to know His voice and follow Him. This is such a crucial part of moving toward the Resurrection if our suffering is to be open to listening to the voice of the Lord and hearing Him. When we are going through a difficult time, it can be easier to hear the voice of the enemy which always is covered in negativity, self-doubt, heavy criticism, etc. Try to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd who affirms our person, and gives us the direction in life that leads to life in abundance. Ask Jesus to reveal His voice to you so you can understand more clearly how He is speaking to you. Make time for listening to His voice each day and look for the doors He opens so you can follow Him.

I believe, in life, we all have voices we listen to and follow. Try to think of the dominant voice in your life that you follow. Is it a voice coming through social media or news outlets? Is this the primary voice you follow? Is it the voice of someone else in your life who you feel you need to impress or follow in some way to fit in? Is it a voice of the culture in some way that pulls you in different directions and speaks for your life? Or is it truly Jesus you are listening to?

Listening to the voice of the Good Shepherd should be at the center of each day for us. Ask yourself each day, “is Jesus leading me today or is someone else?” And, “is Jesus guiding my daily choices or is something/someone else?” May we remember this Good Shepherd Sunday that we belong to Christ and His fold and may He be the one who Shepherds us!
