From the Pastor

Hi all!

I hope you had a very blessed July 4th last week and were able to celebrate the 250-year anniversary of our nation! We look forward to our Vacation Bible School this week! Thanks to Matt Griffith for his hard work and preparation and thank you to all the volunteers who help make this week a great success!

I would like to update you all concerning the Church Renovation project at St. Barnabas. I have been working with the St. Barnabas community for the past several years on fundraising and planning a major Church Renovation project that will include a new narthex, total renewal of the interior of the worship space, and renovated adoration chapel. Finally, this project is about to begin Monday, July 20th and the last Mass for St. Barnabas in the current worship space will be the 5:30pm Mass on Sunday, July 19th. The church building will be under construction for approximately one year and so we hope to have it reopened the summer of 2027.

Weekend Mass at St. Barnabas will be moved to the gym with a modified schedule of 4:30pm Saturday, 8am, 9:30am, 11am, 5:30pm Sunday (the OLG weekend Mass schedule remains the same as we currently have). I would anticipate that some St. Barnabas parishioners will not want to have Mass in the gym and will be with us at OLG just for your awareness. Also, I am moving all daily Masses from St. Barnabas to OLG. The Mass times do not conflict with any OLG daily Mass times since we have ours at noon. The St. Barnabas daily Mass schedule is 8:30am Monday, Tuesday, Friday, Saturday, and 7am Wednesday and Thursday. Please feel free to come for any of these Masses! There will also be Confessions offered for this year of construction at OLG after the 8:30am Saturday morning Mass. This will be in addition to our usual Confession times.

Weddings and Funerals from St. Barnabas will take place at OLG, too. However, with anything being brought to OLG for this year my policy is that it does not interfere with anything on our schedule.

I do ask that we be welcoming to any visitors (as we always would be anyway) and really do our best to work together as one this year. Let's stay united in the Body of Christ and as a Catholic Church and bring glory to God through this year of sacrifice and some inconveniences for both parishes. Our Lady of Guadalupe parish is a wonderful community filled with good, holy people and I know that will be reflected outward as we journey through this year. If you have questions about this, please ask me or Fr. Jeffrey. Thank you so much!

This weekend, we hear of the parable of the sower in Matthew's Gospel. This reading explains very well a common experience of the spiritual life. As Jesus teaches us, some seed "fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold (NAB, Matthew 13:4-8)."

Our goal is to bear this rich soil in our lives that bears continued spiritual fruit. We all go through the ups and downs of being really devoted to our faith then falling away. This would be like the seed that falls on rocky ground and sprouts up quick but then withers away.

To attain rich soil in our walk with Christ, consistency is important. We need to make commitments and really do our best to follow through with them so that the Holy Spirit will continue to work in our hearts to become that rich soil.

Maybe you came off of one of our retreats this past year and really desired to pray more and live differently. Have you followed through with this? What can you commit to so the graces can continue to flourish? Try to make small commitments and be faithful to them like praying for 15 minutes a day, coming to worship God every Sunday at Mass, being open each day to who God is calling you to help, perhaps reading the Bible or another spiritual reading.

Lastly, ask God for the rich soil to be present in your life and tell Him you desire to bear fruit that will multiply. This was always very evident in the lives of the Saints. I pray the Holy Spirit will do the same thing in our lives and parish too!

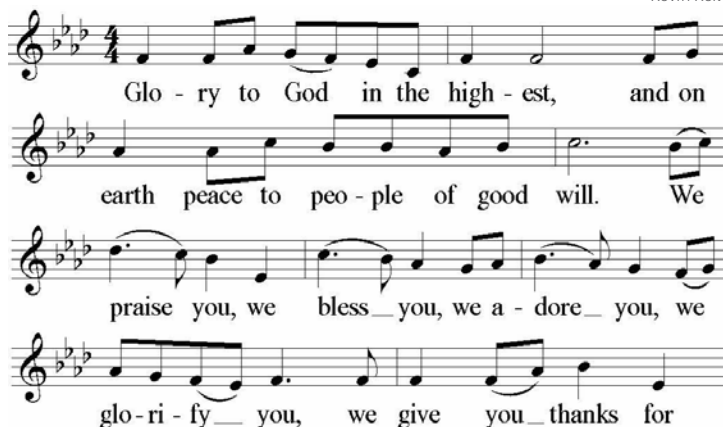

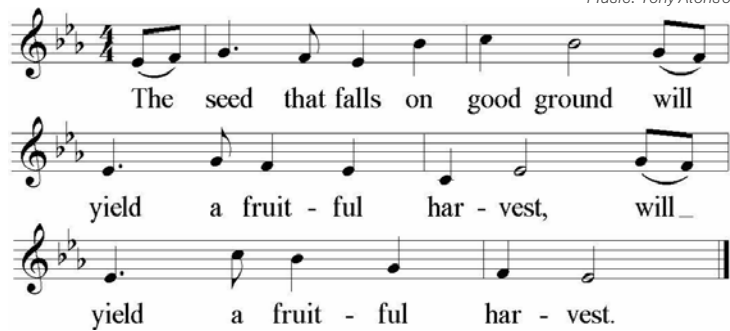

The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because *they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand*. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: *You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them*. "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it. "Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."
