From the Pastor

Hi, everyone! I would like to again thank Matt Griffith and all the volunteers for all of your time and great work this past week for Vacation Bible School! It is always a joy to see the kids on campus and have the opportunity to minister to the youth of our parish. Thank you to the families who sent your children to us and I pray it was a very blessed week for them! And perhaps, parents, you enjoyed a few hours each morning to yourself!

I know many of you like to keep up with my competitions and ask frequently about my next race. I am competing in the half-ironman this Sunday, July 19th in Sandusky. I have finished two triathlons (swim, bike, run) in my life, but this is my first time competing in this particular distance. In this race, we swim 1.25 miles in Lake Erie, then bike 56 miles, then run 13.1 miles. There is a seminarian who has been residing at the rectory for the summer also competing in the race, Daniel Libertoure. We are excited about this opportunity and both enjoy the training and competitive components of a triathlon. I will update you next week as to how it goes!

As I mentioned last weekend, St. Barnabas church building is currently under construction and will be for approximately the whole next year. Most likely, we will see some Barnabas parishioners more frequently at OLG on the weekends and I was very grateful to the OLG parish council (whom I met with this past week) which gave a very warm welcome to the project and the Barnabas parishioners. It is always a gift to be able to see our parishes work together to give glory to God.

Again, to remind you, all the daily Masses from St. Barnabas will be at OLG this year, which are 8:30am Monday, Tuesday, Friday, Saturday and 7am Wednesday and Thursday. There will be morning Confessions after the 8:30am Mass on Saturdays. All of our usual OLG daily Masses, Confessions and calendar items will remain the same this year. As always, please feel free to join any of these additional Sacraments for this year at OLG!

I apologize I have not been at many OLG Masses these past few weeks. I have been focusing on getting the St. Barnabas community ready for an exciting but challenging year of many changes. I will also be traveling some over the next few weeks, but I do look forward to being with you soon!!

In Matthew's Gospel for this Sunday, Jesus talks about the weeds and the wheat growing together until the final harvest. We might think, "Well, certainly Jesus would want the weeds to be immediately pulled up." But rather, Jesus says to let them grow together until the harvest. See Matthew chapter 13:24-43 for this weekend's parables.

This lines up very well with our daily experience. The weeds and the wheat often grow together in our lives. Sometimes, we are able to remove weeds, but other times we have to allow them to grow together and let God sift them out when He is ready. You might experience this with certain relationships in your lives. Relationships can often be difficult. Sometimes, we have to sift them out if they become too negative in our lives and perhaps keep leading us down a road to sin. We all have our imperfections and most often we have to learn how to deal with the weeds in our own lives and in the lives of others that we are close to. We cannot simply just remove every relationship in our lives since there would be nothing left! Again, we all have this combination of weeds and wheat that grow together.

I think of difficult family relationships that certainly have weeds and problems. We have to put up the necessary boundaries to deal with these well and charitably, but unless it's a very grave circumstance, it is good for us not to push all these relationships totally out of our lives. Like Jesus is teaching us, we often need to let the weeds and the wheat grow together and God will separate the good from the bad at the appropriate time. It takes prayer and strength from God to deal with the weeds in our lives that we are not capable of removing, whether it be in our personal life or in certain relationships in our lives.

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying:
"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who

sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn."' He proposed another parable to them. "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches.'" He spoke to them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: *I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world.* Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."
