From the Pastor

Hi everyone!

Thank you for your interest and support of the Half Ironman Triathlon in Sandusky last weekend! Due to the storm the night before, the swim portion was canceled since the current was too strong. However, the bike and run portion went really well and I was very happy with my times. I will say my pride was a bit crushed by not being able to complete the full event but I did walk away very happy with my performance. I guess this is God telling me just to get ready for another one!

In our second reading from Romans, chapter 8, we hear an often-quoted verse from St. Paul where he states, "We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose (NAB, Romans 8:28)." This verse is often quoted for good reason since it really is a verse of great hope.

We all deal with the messiness of life in some way. Some of the problems exist in our lives because we have caused them perhaps through our sins, failings or shortcomings. Many things exist in our lives that are out of our control and are just part of the daily crosses we have to endure. We can often be left feeling somewhat helpless or defeated in certain seasons of life while others might feel more confident and victorious. As we begin to pursue Jesus intentionally in our lives and really seek Him out each day to the best of our ability, over time we begin to notice that God has a way of directing things in our lives for our good, even the things that don't seem like they can take on that direction. It is amazing to begin to see even the unfortunate moments of life work for our good!

As a priest, I hear countless stories of peoples lives and what they are going through. Many of them have not got to the point yet where they really see God's hand directing their pain, and misfortunes for their good but there are some who definitely have. I have heard more than a few people tell me that the cancer they suffered became one of the greatest blessings in their lives. It is shocking for me to hear this and my initial reaction is to want to tell them that they don't have to say that to make God "happy" but I know from the confidence in their voice that they really intend it!

I believe when St. Paul tells us that "all things work for good for those who love God" it is really important not to skip over the second part. It is easy to say "well God will use all for my good" but St. Paul makes clear to us that this is true for "those who love God." If we truly love God in our lives, we will give Him our hearts, attention and make Him a priority in our lives. It is easy to say "I love God" and never pray, go to Mass, or try to live out my faith. But if this is the case, then do I really love God or is this just empty words? God will direct all for our good in His own timing and mysterious way – this is not for us to figure out or manipulate but is for Him to reveal in time. But it is for us to love Him which means to truly give of our self to Him. When we make a consistent effort here, then overtime, I believe we will see more and more how He can use all for our good.

Lastly, the next verse is significant too when St. Paul says, "For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son." I believe through all the messiness of life when we truly love God and He works all for our good we come to acknowledge this as we become more and more conformed to the image of His Son. In other words, God uses all in our lives ultimately to make us more like Christ and this is for our good since Christ is our true joy and fulfillment.

Please take time to pray with our second reading from Romans, chapter 8, for this weekend. It is only a few verses and they are powerful verses we can all relate to in some way. Give God a chance to speak to your life through these verses!
