From Fr. Jeffrey Lindholm



I am not sure how everyone feels about this summer, but it sure feels like it flew by! Usually, summer is a little bit quieter, with time for rest, vacation, and social activities. Both St. Barnabas and OLG have been doing some renovation projects, so that has added a lot of exciting work for our schedules! I must say, it has been a blessing to have a front row seat to God’s grace as the Spirit continues to move in our parish.

Part of renovation is asking the Lord to build the house: “Unless the LORD build the house, they labor in vain who build” (Psalm 127:1, NABRE). It is the living God who dwells in the house of this parish community. Even more than that, the living God dwells in the house of our hearts. And if God is not the very foundation of both this church renovation project and of our hearts, then all of the work we do is in vain.

If we simply do renovation projects without God at the center, then the project is not worth it. This is all about giving God glory through our lives, our families, our parish, and our school! If God is not glorified in what we do, then we are laboring in vain. But if we allow God to use our small gifts, then the end result will be holiness, joy, and a house that is truly pleasing to God – the house of our hearts and of this church community.

But we may think that what we have to offer is so miniscule or insignificant. I imagine that is what the person in today’s Gospel felt like as well: all he/she had was five loaves and two fish. And what did Jesus do with that? He multiplied them so that all ate and were satisfied, and there were *twelve* wicker baskets left over! If Jesus is in the business of multiplying fishes and loaves, just picture and dream what he can do with hearts open to transformation!

Whatever fragments we bring to God, the Lord will multiply and transform them. Whatever small thing we can offer to the Lord, He will delight in it and transform it into gifts poured out for your family, your colleagues, and this parish community. Maybe we feel inadequate at work or in our home. Maybe we feel like we cannot contribute enough time or talent to serve our family or parish community. Maybe it feels like our house is completely out of order and Jesus needs to completely redo the house of our hearts. Wherever we find ourselves, we can take consolation in the fact that the fragments are enough for our Lord to work.

He will take those fragments and make them into something beautiful. The fragments of our hearts and lives will be an opportunity for God’s grace to enter in. Are we willing to depend on God in our weakness and inadequacies? Are we going to trust in God, even when it feels like the house is (quite literally) being demolished? Because the demolition and fragments are not just left over... they are used to build something beautiful: a temple worthy for God to dwell in.

God dwells in Our Lady of Guadalupe Church... and in you. Let Him take those fragments and transform them.

Matthew 14: 13 -21

When Jesus heard of the death of John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. The crowds heard of this and followed him on foot from their towns. When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, and he cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples approached him and said, "This is a deserted place and it is already late; dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." But they said to him, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." Then he said, "Bring them here to me," and he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, who in turn gave them to the crowds. They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments left over—twelve wicker baskets full. Those who ate were about five thousand men, not counting women and children.
