From Fr. Jeffrey Lindholm



In case you did not know, I love to read. Ever since I was a little kid, I have been an avid reader. Even when I was in fifth grade, I was the top ranked reader in my class (not that I am keeping track!!).

When I was a sophomore at Boston College, I had the opportunity to take a class on CS Lewis by one of the great philosophers of our time, Dr. Peter Kreeft. In that class, we read the classic works by CS Lewis (*Mere Christianity*, *Surprised by Joy*, etc.). But we also read his lesser-known works, like *Till We Have Faces* and *The Problem of Pain*. In the latter work, Lewis has a quote that stopped me dead in my tracks when I first read it: "But pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, but shouts in our pains: it is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world."

"Pain is God's megaphone to rouse a deaf world." That is an absolutely crazy quote. But it does not make it any less true. Lewis' quote on pain goes against every human sensibility when it comes to pain and suffering. Yet, it seems like pain is one of the universal human experiences that defines us as human beings. It is not a question of *if* we will suffer, but a question of *how* we will suffer.

Too often, we tend to simply "white knuckle" our suffering and say something along the lines of, "If I just get through this, then I'll get better." But the issue with this line of thinking is that it does not unite our suffering to God. It assumes that we can simply "power through" our struggles without prayer, grace, and the sacraments. Rather, what Lewis is saying here is that God actually *screams* His love to us in our pain.

But there is a caveat: we have to be open to what God has to say. First, we have to unite our suffering and pain to the God who suffered for us on the Cross, Jesus Christ. But then we have to listen. What does God want to say in my pain? Am I aware that God is crying with me in my suffering? What word of love does God want to speak as my heart cries out for healing, reconciliation, peace, comfort, and/or grief?

I can say for myself that I find it hard to believe that my own pain has been God's megaphone to invite my heart closer to Him. But as I reflect on my own life, I can see how my most painful experiences have also been moments of tender communion with the God who suffered for me. Maybe I didn't recognize it at the time, but I have learned through my pain that I am not alone, I am His, and I can trust that God is working to bring resurrection life through my suffering.

God whispers in our pleasures, speaks through our consciences... but He shouts through our pain. Why? Because God wants your pain. He wants you to know that He suffered (and suffers) for you. And He wants you to know that He can heal you.

So how will you suffer? May we unite our pain to God's loving heart, and hear His tender, loving voice cry out, "Behold, I am with you always until the end of the age." For pain is God's megaphone to get our hearts to beat, to bleed, and to be one with His heart.
