From the Pastor



Hi, everyone!

This weekend's Gospel from Matthew Chapter 18 is on forgiveness, which, of course, is a common theme in the Bible. Even though we hear of forgiveness often in our Scripture readings and ask for it every time we pray the Our Father, it remains a central theme because of how much we do need to practice it in our lives.

Peter is trying to understand from Jesus how often he must forgive when his brother sins against him. Perhaps Peter is tired of forgiving someone who keeps hurting him and wonders if there is a time where it is appropriate to not forgive and just remain hardened. Jesus responds by telling Peter to forgive "not seven times, but seventy-seven times" or, in other words, that he should continue to forgive. This is a hard task and so Jesus follows up with a parable by helping Peter first focus not on the hard task, but rather on God's generosity in forgiveness. In the parable, the king was willing to forgive a huge amount for his servant since he pleaded with him to do so.

God is truly incredibly generous to us in loving us and forgiving us when we fail! He never tires of offering us another chance to repent and begin new again. He even went so far to take our sins upon Himself on the cross so that we can be forgiven and made new when we repent. Think of how amazing the Sacrament of Reconciliation truly is! We have access to this "clean slate" on a regular basis and how blessed we are to be given this continuous opportunity on earth to go to Him for forgiveness and a clean soul. Even if we commit grave sin, we can repent and be forgiven by God through the priest in Confession and begin anew. God does not tire in His generosity to forgive large debts in our lives!

Please take time to reflect on how incredibly generous God has been in your life in forgiving you. You might even try praying before a crucifix to help you meditate on His generosity when it comes to forgiveness. Again, let this really sink in. Think of a time you really messed up, went to Confession and left totally relieved and had that feeling of a weight being lifted off of you. Then thank the Lord for giving you that gift!

Jesus repeatedly states that we should love like God and forgive like God. This is not an easy task, but we must first be recipients of the Father's love and forgiveness and then we can better extend that to other people in our lives. If I have not encountered the love of the Father and really entered into the powerful gift of Him forgiving me, then it will be very hard to extend this gift to someone else "from the heart" as Jesus says in the Gospel.

Is forgiveness hard? Yes, it absolutely is! Especially to continue to forgive as Jesus asks of Peter in the Gospel. Jesus invites us to first look to our Heavenly Father and remember how much He has forgiven us and will continue to when we turn to Him. He is extremely generous to us!

Pray for the Holy Spirit to help you forgive the person in your life you need to forgive. Take your time with this and ask for God's grace to help you. Forgiveness is not saying "it does not matter," but it is choosing to release the person of the "debt" against you and pray for their change of heart. It should always be ordered toward the person finding Jesus and growing in holiness. That is what it means to love someone like God loves.

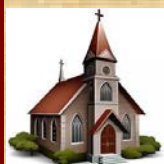

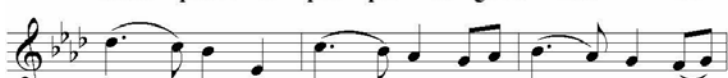

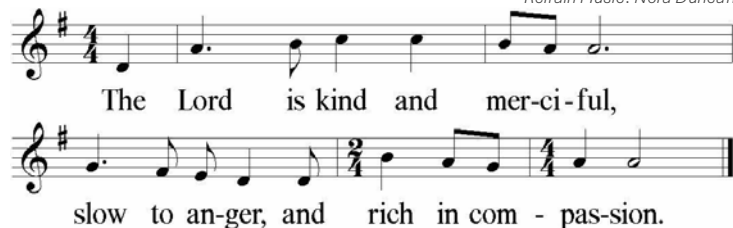

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

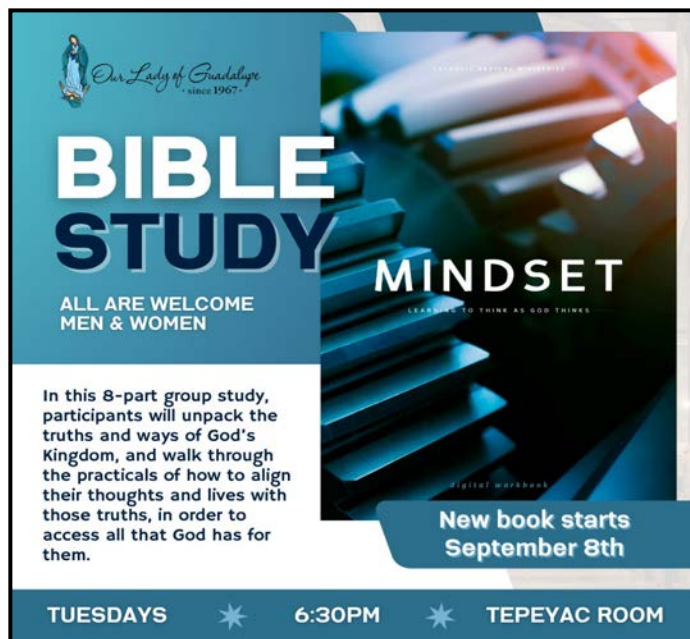
