From the Pastor



Hi everyone! I hope you have a wonderful long weekend as we celebrate Labor Day!

The parish picnic was a huge success last week! Even though we had some light rain it was wonderful to see our people still gather together and spend time celebrating Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish! I heard a lot of positive feedback and cannot thank our parish council enough for their hard work in hosting this picnic!

We are blessed to be given a statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe from Guadalupe in Mexico. This was a gift to us from the Padre Pio prayer group from when they recently went to Guadalupe on pilgrimage. The statue is outside off the walkway by the firepit. Please make a stop and ask for Mary’s intercession for our parish and some need in your life.

As we celebrate Labor Day, I would like to reflect on labor within a Christian context. But first as a reminder, Labor Day is a way of honoring the rights of American workers and making sure they have safe working conditions, reasonable pay and are treated with dignity.

In a Christian context “labor” is an important part of our life in the way God made us. In the book of Genesis, God commanded Adam to till the ground and care for the land in Eden when He said, “The **LORD** God then took the man and settled him in the garden of Eden, to cultivate and care for it (NAB, Genesis 2:15).”

There is a dignity to “work” in a Christian worldview and it is part of us fulfilling our life mission from God. The important question for us to ask is, “Am I doing the work that God is calling me to do?” And “Is work finding its right place in my life?” We should always be discerning God’s will in our lives in all that we do and this would include our daily work. Are you doing the work God intends for you? Have you ever talked to Him about your career and if you are fulfilling His plan for you? Perhaps God is not calling you to switch jobs or careers but approach your daily work with a different mindset. St. Paul often reminds us to put on the “mind of Christ (NAB, 1 Corinthians 2:16).”

If your career is all about making more money, climbing the ladder, and being more powerful in your job, then this would not be glorifying God but really trying to bring glory to yourself. It is certainly good to grow in our careers, take on leadership roles, and even make a better salary but this should always be in service to God and your primary vocation. So, you could ask yourself, “If I am growing in my career, am I approaching it with a servant’s mindset or a selfish one?”

When we invite Jesus into our daily life through a life of prayer, then Jesus can use all to sanctify us and help us to grow in holiness. This would include our “work.” Everything we do from writing papers, doing desk work, doing household chores or yard work to managing people can all be done for God. We should be intentional with this and offer our daily work to Him and try to be aware throughout our day that we are “working” to bring glory to God and do His will. We can offer meetings, difficult tasks, and our skillsets to Him. In God’s eyes nothing is to be wasted and all can be for Him and to glorify Him and in doing this, God will sanctify our day so all is ordered towards our growth in holiness. Offering our work to God will also keep us in the mindset of serving Him through our work and treating people with dignity rather than it becoming a selfish endeavor.

Lastly, does work have its “right” place in my life? In our American culture we tend to hit the extremes well on many things and this would include work. I am generalizing some but we tend to easily fall into the trap of not working at all and totally depending on others, or overworking and becoming a workaholic. Again, there is a dignity and calling to work in our lives and its part of our growth in holiness by serving God in our work but it should have its “right” place in our lives which would be in service of our vocations. If you are married then your work should be in service of providing for your family and future. If your life starts to become all about your career and you begin to spend less and less time with your family because of work (especially if its not required for your job) then perhaps work is taking on too much of a dominant role in your life.

Remember that one of the Ten Commandants is to honor the Lord’s Day and take a day of rest for worship and time with family. God designed us in such a way to work to glorify Him but also to rest in Him. Both need to be part of our life!

Or do you find yourself not working enough and falling into laziness and sloth? Making commitments to have a regular work schedule both to provide for oneself or family, and keeping up with one’s task in a household is a part of our fulfilling God’s will in our lives. This daily effort of “tilling the garden” and working in our homes, communities and work places will be part of our sanctification and preparation for Heaven. Pray for understanding as to how God is calling you to serve Him each day especially as it pertains to your daily work!
