FROM THE PASTOR



Hi, everyone!

I was blessed to have PSR Mass this past week to get the year going! Confirmation preparation also began last Sunday, and I know many of our groups are getting started! OCIA is also up and going, and we potentially have a few people interested. Please continue your prayers for all of our ministry efforts this year!

This past week, we celebrated two powerful feast days back-to-back. On Monday, September 14th, we celebrated The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and on Tuesday, we celebrated The Feast of the Sorrowful Mother.

I always love observing how the Holy Spirit works through the Liturgical calendar to meet us where we are in our lives. I notice this often with feast days we celebrate and with keeping up with the Sunday Scripture readings each week. If you get in the habit of following the feast days each week and the Sunday readings, you might be shocked at how well they speak to your life and give you what you need to hear!

The Exaltation of the Cross first celebrates the cross of Jesus and, really, the discovery of Jesus' cross by St. Helena (the emperor Constantine's mother back in the 4th century). I won't go into all the details here as to how she discovered Jesus' cross (please read up on that if you have a chance), but I want to focus more on the reality of the cross in our lives. Every one of us, without exception, bears a cross in our lives. I believe when we turn to the Lord, He helps lift many crosses for us, but there is always somewhere He permits a cross to remain. Sometimes, this is an ongoing relationship struggle that just does not seem to get resolved. It might be a challenge you are having with a child, or perhaps taking care of an elderly parent. The cross in your life can be an illness that is taking longer than you want to heal, or it can be a situation where you are not understood the way you want to be by someone you love. It might be enduring job difficulties to provide for your family.

God permits this cross to remain in our lives because He wants to do something with it in our lives. Maybe it is a source of humility for us, where we have to lean more about God and less about ourselves. Perhaps God will change our perspective and our attitude about something in our lives through the cross. The cross is a place where we need Jesus to enter with us and is a place where we can have intimacy with the Lord. In our deepest suffering and poverty, we can learn God's love for us and learn to love Him so much more since we begin to "get out of the way" and, in a sense, have no choice but to turn more to God.

We can only exalt the cross because Christ has conquered it, and this is true for our personal cross too. We must learn to meet Jesus in our cross and pray into this difficult space of our lives. Again, God is permitting this to remain because He wants to do something with it in your life – ask Him what that is. Instead of it being a place of frustration, let it be a place where you meet Jesus. Ask Him, "Where are you, Lord, in this cross?" Jesus has the power to conquer your cross with you!

The next day's Feast of the Sorrowful Mother follows beautifully. Mary stands by Jesus on the cross. (see John 19:25-27) She is there with Him as He suffers, and she suffers with Him because she loves Him. As Luke tells us, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted and you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." (NAB, Luke 2:35) Mary loves you too and stands right by you in your cross. She supports you and prays for you, and you can come to know her motherly help in your cross. We also stand by people in their crosses and learn to support them through their suffering. This is the Christian way!

Where is the place in your life that God has not lifted, and the cross remains? Have you found Jesus there yet? Have you understood the support of your spiritual Mother there with you? As we think about our cross and wonder, "Why God?" turn to Isaiah's words for this weekend's readings: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." (NAB, Isaiah 55:8-9)

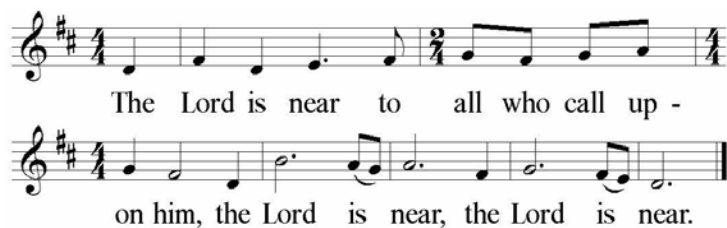

Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

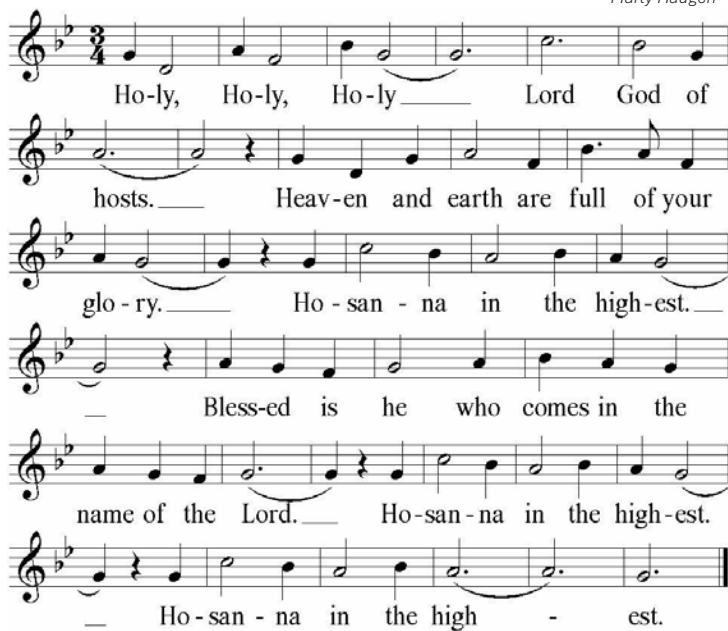

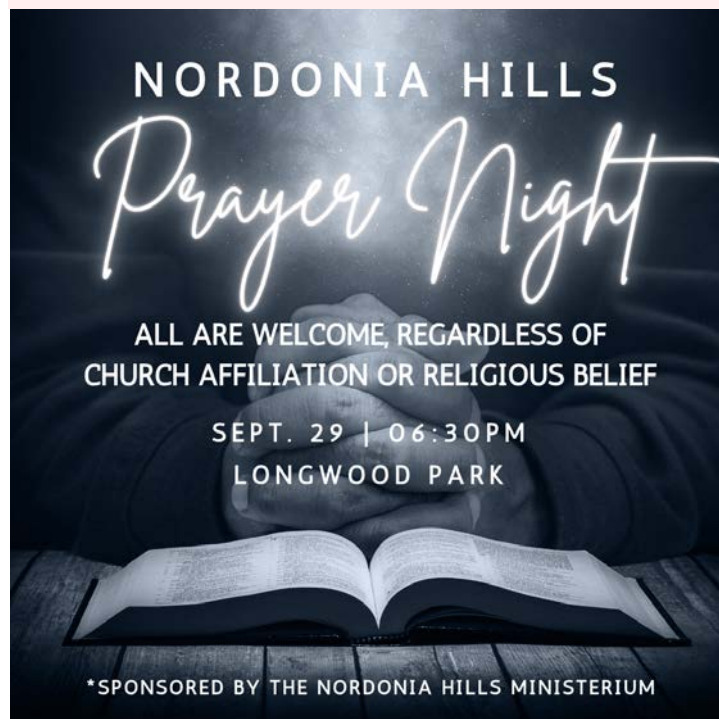
